


Paper Sizes Explained



The A series are the most frequently used paper sizes. Paper sizes in the series (A1, A2, A3, etc.) are defined by halving the preceding paper size, cutting parallel to its shorter side.

The C series is used only for envelopes. They are slightly larger than A sizes, a letter written on A4 paper fits inside a C4 envelope but is commonly folded to fit inside a DL envelope.

There is also a **B series** but this is less common. It is mainly used for special situations such as posters and books. B size envelopes are slightly larger than C sizes so a C4 envelope fits inside a B4 envelope.
